The aim of the Learning Program is to improve patient outcomes in Subacute Care (SAC) through the delivery of evidence based, coordinated care, embedding a culture of excellence within SAC services, and developing workforce skills and knowledge.

Modules delivered in this session:

- Person Centred Care (8:30—10:00)
- Motivational Interviewing (10:30 - 12:00)
- Trauma Informed Care (12.30-14:00)
- Staff Health and Wellbeing (14:15 - 15:30)

By attending this training you will gain knowledge and practical strategies to assist you to deliver more person centred care, and to support your patients to make changes in their behaviour to improve their own health through motivational interviewing. You will gain a greater understanding of the impact of trauma, exploring outcomes and responses, including how our brain responds to trauma, as well as key support principles, and the main protective factors. Finally, health staff are under enormous pressure at the moment. Caring for your own health and wellbeing is an important component of caring for others.

This training is available free to WA Health employees, including staff from SJOG Midland and Mt Lawley, and Peel and Joondalup Health Campuses. It is suitable for any allied health, nursing, medical and support staff working in rehabilitation, geriatric evaluation and management.
