Preface

On 24th July 2021, Synapse in Western Australia facilitated their inaugural Brain Injury Network event in Perth. Providers from a broad range of public and private, government and not for profit services attended this event and have contributed to this document by mapping the services they provide to people impacted by brain injury. Other service providers listed in this document have contributed subsequent to the network event.

This Brain Injury Service Map provides information on a range of public, private and community services which support people with a brain injury in Western Australia.

It includes: a description of the *service, referral process, eligibility,* and *current capacity* of a range of services and supports available in WA to people impacted by brain injury from time of acquiring their injury to 12 months post-hospital discharge.

The information in this document has been provided voluntarily by the service providers listed throughout. All effort has been made to check that the information provided is correct at time of completion and release of the latest version.

Stage: HOSPITAL - Admission

Joondalup Health Campus - Stroke Unit

A dedicated area within ward C3 that provides early assessment, time critical therapy and rehabilitation and specific stroke unit care to inpatients with a stroke, suspected stroke, or Trans Ischemic Attack (TIA). The service comprises a 12-bed unit, including 6 hyper-acute care beds, which are co-located with a

therapy space. The Stroke Unit is staffed by a dedicated multidisciplinary team including:

Stroke Consultant, Neurologist and Neuro-Ophthalmologist, Nursing including Stroke Clinical Nurse Specialist, Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapy, Speech Pathology, Social Work and Dietetics.

Sir Charles Gairdner hospital (SCGH) – Acute Neurology (G51) & Neurosurgery (G52)

Provide acute care post stroke, brain injury and other neurological conditions. SCGH

is home to WA's only Comprehensive Cancer Centre, providing specialist

neurosurgical intervention for brain and spinal tumours. Provides early assessment, treatment, and discharge planning (inclusive of referrals to inpatient and outpatient rehabilitation services as required) is provided. Multi-Disciplinary Team includes Occupational Therapy, Physiotherapy, Speech Pathology, Dietitians, Social Work,

Pharmacy.

Stage: HOSPITAL - Inpatient (Rehabilitation)

Perth Children's Hospital (PCH) – Inpatient Acute and Sub Acute (Rehabilitation)

We provide acute assessment and treatment for inpatients following moderate to severe brain injury resulting from trauma, stroke, tumour, infection, autoimmune causes, and other related diagnoses.

Intensive individualised goal directed rehabilitation from Multi-Disciplinary Team including 1:1 therapy, family and caregiver education, discharge planning, NDIS access and planning. Multidisciplinary team includes medical staff, Occupational Therapy, Physiotherapy, ABI Clinical Nurse Specialist, Speech Pathology, Music Therapist, Dietician, Social Work, Clinical Psychology, Neuropsychology, Pharmacy, Case Manager, Teachers. Education liaison and teaching provided by Primary and Secondary school teachers employed by Dept of Education physically located within the hospital, the same teachers are accessible throughout the patient journey.

ELIGIBILITY: 0-16yrs

Fiona Stanley Fremantle Hospital Group (FSFHG) – NDIS Linkage Team

We provide consultation and advice to hospital inpatient staff about NDIS processes. The purpose of our service is to build workforce capacity when working with the NDIS. This can include running education and training, case management support, escalation, as well as development of resources, templates, and pathways

ELIGIBILITY: Any clinician at FSFHG requiring support with NDIS related issues can refer.

Generally, we support teams when the patient requires NDIS funded supports for a

safe or sustainable discharge from hospital.

WA Country Health Service (WACHS)

Albany; Bunbury; Busselton; Geraldton offer inpatient rehabilitation for a range of neurological conditions. Patients may be referred directly to these hospitals for rehabilitation or may undergo rehabilitation at a metropolitan hospital prior to going to a regional hospital.

Other country hospitals may take patients as part of discharge planning / transition to community but may not offer rehabilitation.

Stage: HOSPITAL – Preparation for Discharge and Outpatient Services

Perth Children's Hospital (PCH) – Sub-Acute Outpatient Rehab (iRehab)

The iRehab Service is an outpatient rehabilitation service. The multidisciplinary team provide time limited, goal directed intensive rehabilitation for children and young people following acquired brain injury. iRehab also provides intensive rehabilitation for children with cerebral palsy, spinal cord injuries, neuromuscular disorders, complex multi-trauma.

Two primary streams:

- 1. Post-Inpatient Subacute Rehabilitation
- 2. Community Referrals for Children more remote from their injury.

Community referrals are assessed for eligibility based on existing services, specific needs and goals of rehabilitation.

Team members include; Case Manager, Clinical Nurse Specialist, Medical, Occupational therapy, Physiotherapy, Speech Therapy, Social Work, Case Manager, Clinical Psychology, Neuropsychology, Primary and Secondary Teachers from Department of Education (liaison and teaching roles).

Eligible families from outside the Perth Metro area can stay at Ronald McDonald House during the program.

Currently run as face to face only with current development of Tele-Rehab model underway.

Perth Children's Hospital (PCH) – Acquired Brain Injury (ABI) Outpatient Service

The Acquired Brain Injury Service provides monitoring and surveillance following childhood acquired brain injury. The service includes access to Rehabilitation Medical, ABI Clinical Nursing, Clinical Psychology, Neuropsychology, Community Mental Health Nurse Support, Education Liaison and Case Management.

In conjunction with the young person's family, General Practitioner and Community Team – the Service can provide Paediatric Rehabilitation Management; access to time-limited psychological assessment and



intervention including in-home support for families from Community Mental Health Nursing. Advocacy, referral, support and linkages with relevant hospital services and community agencies.

Transition to appropriate adult-based services from 16 onwards.

Fiona Stanley Hospital – State Rehabilitation Service: Outpatient Medical Acquired Brain Injury (ABI)

Provision of tertiary level care in which the primary clinical purpose or treatment goal is improvement in the functioning of a patient with an impairment, activity limitation or participation restriction due to an acquired brain injury. The patient is capable of actively participating. The service supports self-management, minimises acute episodes and hospitalization, prevent deterioration.

traumatic brain injuries)

Rehabilitation in the Home (RITH)

We provide intensive home-based, short-term rehabilitation after inpatient discharge, and see people with all diagnoses, including ABI survivors. We are a multidisciplinary team of senior Allied Health clinicians and have Registrars, Rehabilitation or Geriatrician Consultants as part of our team.

Our staff are highly experienced in providing rehabilitation to survivors of stroke, traumatic brain injury, hypoxic brain injury, spinal cord injury, neurological and neurodegenerative conditions. Our staff are aware of the impact on environment on rehabilitation and are comfortable working with families and in the community.

ELIGIBILITY: Referrals are accepted when the patient:

Requires allied health services that would otherwise require inpatient admission and

can not be provided in an outpatient or community setting.

Is medically stable

Has an accessible and safe home environment

Can actively participate in a goal orientated rehabilitation program

Consents to receiving Rehabilitation in the Home

Lives within the Rehabilitation in the Home catchment area.

REFERRAL PROCESS: Referrals are made by the inpatient allied health team, prior to discharge home.

National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS)

There are around 4.3 million Australians who have a disability. Within the next five years, the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) will provide more than \$22 billion in funding a year to an estimated 500,000 Australians who have permanent and significant disability. For many people, it will be the first time they receive the disability support they need.

The NDIS can provide all people with disability with information and connections to services in their communities such as doctors, sporting clubs, support groups, libraries and schools, as well as information about what support is provided by each state and territory government.

ELIGIBILITY: Under 65yrs

Live in Australia and have Australian residency

Permanent disability / impairment with substantially reduced functional capacity

Must be most appropriately funded by NDIS
